- Swansea Surf Life Saving Club founded 1927-28 season: green, cream and gold colours adopted
- First Executive President Joe Charlton; Secretary Harold Hall; Treasurer Frank Marshall; Club Captain Jack Chapman; Chief Instructor Ernie Heath
- 1928-29 Boat crew awarded Certificate of Bravery from the Royal Humane and Shipwreck Society for a rescue on the treacherous Swansea Channel bar
- 1931-32 First Australian Championship won by the club senior boat championship at Bondi
- 1935 Crisis period no funds and very few members
- 1936 Joe Charlton elected as the club's first Life Member
- 1942 15th February prominent member Matt Roach AIF killed at fall of Singapore
- 1946 Tom Humphreys' innovative 'tuck stern' surf boat launched. In the same year, fire destroys dance hall and club shed
- 1947 15th September named changed to Swansea-Belmont Surf Life Saving Club

Ross_joined Swansea Belmont SLSC in 1960.


He was a fierce competitor, successful in the R&R swimming and his main activity board paddling.

It has been a pleasure to have Dave Banks back on-board as Director of Lifesaving bringing his wealth of knowledge to share. Over the coming years is going to be one of continued transformation where the club will continue to a new level with the following projects planned under our Building Committee & LMCC:

- Installation of Solar Panels.
- Commencement of work to new Kiosk.
- LMCC to construct a Disabled Viewing Platform in front of Clubhouse.
- Upgrade to upstairs Kitchen & Equipment.
- New DA Plans are currently being been lodged to complete major renovations to the Internal & External building which include a new entrance into the club, external facade modifications, 3 way bar area to service all function areas upstairs, new external stairs to back deck area, increased toilet facilities, new Office area, new entry to downstairs bar, new stairs & entry to back upstairs meeting/function room.

As you can see the above will be a major redevelopment to transform your club facilities & design into the 21st Century & meet the needs of our members, guests, local community & lead to an increase in functions held at the club. All of this will take place over stages to be finalized & comes at a cost well above our clubs current financial position, so we need to secure several grants that will manage the expenses & rely on in-kind donations in labor, materials etc. to make this transformation the biggest in the clubs history. We all must thank the efforts & dedication of our Building Committee & the expert advice & drawings provided by Matt Chalmers along with the support given from LMCC.

Our Crown Lands Lease Agreement is currently being sorted for the future, which will have an impact on both the volunteer & commercial side of the club moving forward. SLS NSW & NSW Department of Primary Industries - Lands have worked together over the last four years to bring in a standardized lease template (20 year minimum term) for affiliated Surf Life Saving Clubs (SLSCs) in NSW that are located on Crown Land. I must say thanks to Chad Griffith for his support & advice in dealing with Hunter Branch & LMCC to get the agreement formalized.

Aside from the support provided by sponsors the club has continued to raise funds through events such as the Golf Day, Lisa Hunt & our regular Sunday Sessions on the Deck with live music which has led to an increase of local community attending the club, once again it would be great to see more members & families support these days. This year



marks the clubs 90th Anniversary so stay tuned for details of this celebration later in the year, anyone willing to assist in the formalization of the event please let me know.

Sadly, this season two of our Life Members passed, Don Gregory (1984) survived by Leslie, Darren, Andrew, Kristy was a colorful character in the surf lifesaving movement following the kids & grand kids to every carnival throughout the country, he was always 1st to put his hand up to tow the Gear trailers to State & Aussies each year & spent his days on the beach supporting all club competitors & then followed up with a debrief each afternoon over a beer. Ross Blatchford (1977) held many committee positions during the 60's, 70's era & was President from 74-76 Ross spent many years as Board Coach setting the standard for the club future Board squads & champions.

In closing, firstly I must thank my patient wife Mel & my beautiful girls for all their support putting up with the endless phone calls, emails & meetings that have taken me away from quality family time throughout the year. Deputy President Report

This season has been an enormous step forward for a club that is rebuilding. The culture of the club has grown with the strength of the executive making decisions and improving the experiences for our members.

The unity the club displayed whilst hosting a successful NSW Championships was first class. A large thank you goes to all who volunteered their time, effort and dedication to ensure a seamless event. The annual Golf Day proved successful again with 33 teams on course at Belmont, raising over \$9,000 for essential lifesaving equipment.

This season, the NSW Government through two funding programs. First grant of \$121,500 from the Surf Club Development for maintenance, and upgrades the facility. Works have commenced with further upgrades to be rolled out before the end of 2017. Second grant of \$24,500 from Stronger Communities for solar panels to reduce our growing energy bills. Thank you to Yasmin Catley – State Member for Swansea for her commitment to our surf club and support shown.

Club NSW continues the support of the club through Grants. Thank you to the Pelican RSL and Belmont 16 Footers.

I feel the club is in a wonderful position with new and old members joining together to grow the club. The mixture of Surf Sports, Lifesaving, Education and Member Services is well balanced. Looking forward to 2017/18 season.

Treasurer Report

The financial results included in this report and in the formal Financial Report (available on request) are for the ten-month period from July 2016 to April 2017. The reporting period has been reduced to allow the Annual General Meeting to be held earlier than has been previous practice. For all future years the accounting period will be the twelve-month period from May to April each year.

In the ten months to April 2017 the Swansea Belmont SLSC reported a cash surplus before depreciation of \$228,654 and as at April 30 2017 held "cash and cash equivalents" of \$581,657.

Much of this surplus has been due to:

- A one-off Grant from Surf Lifesaving NSW of \$121,787
- A net surplus from hosting the 2017 NSW Surf Lifesaving Titles of \$71,357

Even without the above items, however the club would still have reported a cash surplus before depreciation of \$35,510, which is similar to the surplus recorded in the full twelve months to June 2016. The most significant other factor in this result is a surplus of \$93,582 from Bar and Functions activities which is a \$30,879 improvement from the previous year. These healthy financial outcomes allowed the club to maintain expenditure \$173,418 on its usual activities of:

- Lifesaving & Competition \$97,109 (56%)
- Maintenance of facilities \$51,395 (30%)
- Club Administration \$24,914 (14%)

Annual depreciation has been calculated as \$65,576, which is mostly a reduction in the carrying value of the clubhouse. After depreciation, the club reported a net surplus of \$163,078.

The club has also incurred capital expenditure during the year of \$15,617 most of which was spent on installing new bathroom facilities at the boatshed.

The data in this report and in the following statements are preliminary only as they have yet to be fully audited at the time of finalizing this report.

Registrar's Report

We have 570 members this season, down from 629 last season, ranging from Juniors right through to the Senior level including Associates/Life Members.

I know this is a repeat from last season, but **A BIG THANK YOU** to all the members who paid their fees early in the season, please remember **no fee payment** means **no gym use** and **more importantly no insurance cover!** So please everyone knows that each year a fee is involved – **so come on pay the fee get it over with and be covered!**

Last season, I was fairly busy trying to update Surfguard with everyone's member Protection form and their Working with Children's number – at the end of the season I sent out over 300 individual emails asking members for this information. Out of the 358 people I was asking information from only 170 have replied or advised me of this information. Just over half! I know people have said they have passed the details on – but sorry it hasn't come to my attention and I need to have the numbers to updated in Surfguard!

If you are up to the age of 17, you only need to complete a Member Protection form, sign it and have parent/guardian consent as well. If you are 18 years or over and have contact with **ANY** children in the surf club, then you must obtain a Working With Children's number.

This requirement will be compulsory from $1^{\rm st}$ April 2016 and it would be appreciated if every member involved could please advise me or send through to me, if not already sent through) a copy of their Working With Children's confirmation. The Office of the Children's Guardian will be doing random audits from now on – if they find we do not have all members concerned covered then there will fines of up to \$10,000 per individual and \$10,000 to the Club.

Volunteers must go to:

www.check.kids.nsw.gov.au – complete and finalize the form, print it off and take your Application number to NSW Motor Registry with proof of identity. Once you receive your number, takes about 4 weeks to obtain, then you MUST give this number to the Club Registrar as your information must be first verified on the Working with Children's website and then placed in Surfguard. There is no cost and it lasts for 5 years.

Wishing the club all the best for the coming 2017/2018 season.

Director Of Life Saving Report

What a year we have put together, for many of you this may be like any other year, however for me with a fresh set of eyes and renewed enthusiasm for the club I saw a successful year of everyone working together, a culture of success across our club and above all the clubbie spirit and mateship that binds us all.

I talk about the numbers, they provide us with some indicators and trends on our performance and the direction we are heading, however more importantly they tell us about the people who put in the hard work to achieve not only the results but to achieve the reason we are here.

Patrol stats.

Who are we serving and keeping safe on our beach. Based on our scientific counting methodology we had 44,650 visitors to our beach during the season, resulting in 50 recorded first aid events and 5 rescues. Only 5 rescues, that's not very impressive, that's because our 227 preventions prevented the need for additional rescues.

- Some of the basics to be proud of:
- Total of 5242 patrol hours in 2016/2017 season
- Total patrol hours, up 19%, more members on patrol
- Rostered hours up 28%. More volunteering to do patrol
- Rostered hours completed up 26%, more people meeting their commitment to the club and community.
 - Substitute hours, up 22%, more members helping each other out.
 - No shows, down 44%, more members making a promise and fulfilling it
 - Number of patrol members up 7%.

All the indicators are heading in the right direction and we as a club can be proud of our efforts and the difference it makes to our community. In part it can feel mundane and on a cold wet afternoon on the fringe of the season you wonder why am I here. Those thoughts are soon replaced with joy and pride the next time you stand on the beach enjoying the morning sun warming the sand, your mates around you and nippers flashing by on the sprint track.

Sure we have some work to do to make your patrols more engaging, interesting and enjoyable. Your committee does not hold all the answers, let alone all the questions, hence this season I engaged you and your patrolling mates to ask what's working, what needs improving and how we can better support each other.



Patrol Survey

The patrol survey launched on the 5th May 17 and left to run over a 3 week period received an overwhelming response rate. 69 people or 51% of patrolling members took the time to response to a handful of questions covering everything from you and your patrolling experience to what do you need, want and prefer in terms of support and training. I thank you for your candid responses and feedback on some of the tougher topics often difficult to cover off face to face.

A snapshot of the survey:

- 39% of respondents were 'Active 18yrs & over' members
- 80% male 20% Female
- 88% were patrolling members
- 85% want to remain on their current patrols
- 13% are seeking more responsibility on patrol
- 90% of respondents will patrol again next year.
- The majority of respondents would like a incentive to patrol, 30% said none, I just will continue to patrol.
 - My favourite, more patrol functions to celebrate our efforts and commitment.
 - What do you want? 52% said refresher training and 57% patrolling with friends.
 - Finding substitutes remains one of our major challenges.
 - We have a healthy appetite for more training across the board.

This year we have taken delivery of \$7000 worth of patrol and lifesaving equipment with another \$8,000 in upgrades to training and education equipment to come. This will help us deliver more training, when you want it and how you want it. The equipment will roll out for the 2017/18 season along with training to support you in it's use.

During the offseason, the ATV will be converted into a mobile patrol vehicle with rescue board, spinal board, loudhailer, first aid kit and advanced resus equipment. All designed to allow us to respond more efficiently and effectively, particularly when the shelter is off the beach or we are stretched due to carnivals etc.

We are yet to solve the plight of the patrol shelter, it's heavy cumbersome and ineffective for looking after our members and public on patrol. We definitely need to solve the problem of our aging patrol shelter, I look to our members for ideas and designs.

The overwhelming concern from our members are the number of hours we spend on patrol each year. Agreed, we enjoy the commitment, however not feeling condemned to the commitment. As a club, we have signed up to the days and hours we patrol, our President has lobbied hard to reduce these hours to no avail. The politics outweigh the concerns of individual clubs. What we have is the might of numbers in our club to train more people, encourage more members and enjoy the best lifestyle in Australia on patrol.



Our two largest groups in our club membership is our juniors and associates. We are developing our juniors to become the best they can be, let's ensure that includes lifesaving and competition. Let's also encourage the parents of our juniors to be involved, lead by example and potentially gain some new skills and confidence.

In simple terms, a 20% increase (27 members) in patrolling members will reduce our individual hours by 20% per year.

Next season we see the introduction of full time lifeguards to our beach, this comes with mixed feelings and divided opinions, however I would like to see us approach this with optimism and opportunity to build our patrols, increase our skill levels and ultimately show the council we can and do provide an effective service to our community.

We have challenged the lifeguard service [council] to better engage with clubs, manage the beach together and put our public first as we work together. Next season will be interesting and challenging, however with the right attitude I believe it can be a successful mix of resources that will allow us to give you some relief on patrols.

Looking ahead, we have some challenges and many more opportunities to continue building on the great work being done across the club and in doing so further build on the successful history and memories of the members before us.


















Director Of Surf Sports Report

Our patrols are doing a great job of letting surfers with limited experience know that catching dumping waves with just the head out in front is not a good idea. Thankfully, our defibrillators (including the new one) and the oxy-vivas had a very quiet time. I must thank our patrols and especially the Patrol Captains for doing a great job throughout the season.

I must comment on the irony of the first week of the State Championships. Yours truly, was down on the beach as the first aid person for the Champion Life Saver events and the Patrol Competition. There were paramedics, nurses, ambulance drivers and even doctors competing in these events and they were not allowed to start the event until the First Aid person, again, yours truly, was in position for the event. Pressure!!! I was "dying to go"; late in the afternoon, but was not game enough to leave.

We do need more first aid people. If you know of members, supporters, parents, anybody with qualifications who might want to help please let the Club know.

If you want to get qualified please let the Club know. It would be great for our patrols and it would be great for you. Imagine being able to help someone injured while on patrol. Maybe, SAVE A LIFE. Ski Captain's Report

2017 was the first year on our 5-year plan and despite there still being plenty of room in the ski tent numbers were up for State and Australian entries so things are heading in the right direction and we are on track to have competitive U17 and U19 ski paddlers for Taplin Relays and competitive Ski Relay teams over the coming years.

It will be difficult to produce a quality Open paddler for some time so it is important we encourage our younger competitors and make available the resources needed to progress from U17 to U19 and then to Open categories.

To this end, the club provided alternate Board training on Tuesdays and Thursdays to complement the traditional Monday and Wednesday sessions that clashed with the amalgamated Ski squad of Redhead and Swansea Belmont. In response to this we went from zero attendees at Club ski training to 2 then 3 then 5 and finally 7 by the end of the year.

Many thanks to our Northern neighbors who welcomed us and put time into our young paddlers. The return of Sunday Fun day sessions has also introduced over 20 new paddlers to the sport with 5 first year paddlers plus Jack McGregor heading to Sydney recently to take part in the 2017 Harbor Series races.

All paddlers finished no worse than top 5 in their division amongst over 100 entries which is a positive sign for 2018 and beyond. Unfortunately, due to age restrictions, 3 of these paddlers including the $1^{\rm st}$ and $3^{\rm rd}$ place getters of the Open 10km SLSA ski division cannot compete in SLSA carnivals for another 2 years.

Our 2017 Paddler of the Year went to Barry Stanford as a reward for encouraging the younger paddlers to improve so they could paddle away from his nonstop chatter and for his obvious passion for the sport which rubs off on everyone around the shed.

Ben Rees received the Encouragement Award but as I stated at our Presentation Night, Ben needed no encouragement to come for a paddle and is the first of our beginners to progress to turning left at the tip of the break wall on Mondays and Wednesdays evening sessions rather than doing a U-turn when there was a wave on.


