Vale Barry Dobb



Barry Dobb was awarded his SBM on 11th March, 1962 and soon proved to be an outstanding member. As a patrol member and

during several seasons as a patrol captain Barry won the respect of those with whom he came into contact. Instruction of new candidates was Barry's forte in surf life saving. He was first elected to the position of Chief Instructor in 1964-65, held that position for the following season, and then for a four year tem from 1969 to 1973. For the 1973/74 season Barry took over the position of Club Captain. He was heavily involved with Pool Survival in 1976 and 1977 and later served as Radio Officer. Barry was twice awarded the honour of "Clubman of the Year" – 1971 and 1973 and was elevated to Life Membership of the Club in 2010. It was in the 1972/73 season that Barry achieved the notable distinction of training a record number of candidates for the Bronze Medallion. On many occasions during that season the examiner of those squads was John McDougall.

Vale Bill McKenzie

Upon gaining his Bronze Medallion on 9th December, 1951, Bill McKenzie began a lengthy period of enthusiastic service to Swansea-Belmont SLSC. His staunch commitment as a patrol member was followed by many years of support for the club. Bill, as part of a group of "super-veterans", was on hand at almost all of our major functions, including our AGM's and major championship carnivals. Always available to offer encouragement and advice to younger members, Bill McKenzie's smiling face and pleasant demeanor will be missed by all who knew him.



Vale Len Iones

Len came to us in 1950 and remained associated with our club throughout his life. He was a first class patrolman and Patrol Captain possessing remarkable ability in surf swimming and boating, he was a perfect example for any young lifesaver.

He loved the thrill and mateship of competition, he was an Australian Surfboat Champion at Newport in 1953.


Len was a vital member of our early Rescue and Resuscitation teams and a member of the team that won our first Branch Championship in 1961.

Vale John McDougall



John McDougall gained his Bronze Medallion on 26th November, 1965 and was an active patrol member until called up for National Service. During his period of National Service he served a 12-month tour of duty in Vietnam. Following his return to the club in the early '70's he served as Hon Secretary from 1974 until 1976 and had a short stint as Deputy President until his employment necessitated a transfer to Sydney. Whilst in Sydney John was actively involved with North Cronulla SLSC. On his return to our area he again became deeply involved in the club. Until illness took its toll, John's management committee positions at various times included Chairman, Junior Activities; Delegate to the Newcastle Branch; Sports Secretary; Publicity Officer and Registrar. John led the club as President in 1994/95, and occupied the very important position of Chief Instructor from 2002 to 2005.

John's contribution to the Hunter Branch was outstanding. A member of the Board of Examiners for over twenty years, his positions included Zone Supervisor, Branch Competition Director and Assistant Secretary – at that time a Branch Executive position. John was Swansea-Belmont's "Clubman of the Year" for the 2004/05 season, was elevated to Life Membership of the Club in 1997, and Life Membership of Hunter Branch in 2007.

The contribution of both **Barry Dobb** and **John McDougall** to all of our major events - Australian Championships in 1972 and 1994, and NSW Championships in '80, '90, '02, '03, 08', '09, and '10 – cannot be underestimated. Both occupied key positions on organizing committees: gear and equipment, crowd control, parking control and a myriad of other tasks all came under their influence. Even in more recent years both 'Dobby' and 'Macca' took pride in being part of a march past team that carried the clubs' colours on these occasions.



President's Report

It is with great pride & pleasure that I present my 1st Annual Report for the 2014/2015 season on behalf of Swansea Belmont SLSC. I would like to sincerely thank our entire Clubs Management teams for their dedicated voluntary time, guidance & overall enthusiasm for the club. Outside of this team our club is very blessed to have many other dedicated members, trainers & coaches that have the good of the club at heart & are willing to put up a hand to assist in any way when required thus following in the footsteps of many members before them over the past 86 years.

As a member of Surf Life Saving there are many rewarding opportunities available to all that will allow you to contribute to the community, develop your life leadership skills, improve fitness, cultivate youth & interact with a wide network of people. The safety of the public and our member's remains first and foremost, and our safety initiatives were a key priority throughout the year. Swansea Belmont Surf Club is very proud of our members & our role as a community based volunteer emergency service.

Throughout this season our club members along with our excellent working relationship with the local Lake Macquarie City Council Lifeguards once again ensured there were no lives lost on Blacksmiths Beach providing the public with a safe aquatic environment. During our summer months everyone was on alert due to the increasing number of shark sightings along the Coastal areas, this vigilance by our members ensured that all the public enjoying the beach & surf could rest assured that they were in good hands.

Over the past few years the Club has experienced a decline in Patrolling members mainly due to increased work & social demands in today's changing society. This season under the guidance of our Director of Lifesaving Michael Baldock & his team of dedicated volunteers saw an influx of patrolling numbers, after delving into previous season's problems he devised a patrolling format that basically fitted all club members with competition, work or social commitments so Blacksmiths Beach could provide the required patrol members each weekend to ensure our public's safety. Due to his professional approach in a thankless position Michael was awarded our Club Person of the Year along with the prestigious 2014//15 Newcastle Permanent Lifesaver of the Year, now nominated for the NSW Lifesaver of the Year well deserved!



A special thanks to our Education team lead by Chief Training Officer Louise Gain & her invaluable trainers who have played a major role in our lifesaving awards revival & clubs sustainability targets for the Quality Club Program. This team has worked tirelessly over the past year to increase our patrol members education & ongoing award certificates. In saying that our club still needs to recruit & encourage new trainers to help share the workload to provide the development of education programs for our clubs athletes, coaches & Lifesavers!

In the Surf Sports arena our clubs competition teams have once again competed throughout the long season with pride, passion & determination. Our Junior club Coaching Programs continue to be first class setting up our seasoned competitors for success in their chosen disciplines & with perseverance, nurturing add some mental toughness in over many years of training has seen new talent emerge from the squads to knock over the former champions at Branch & State Championships. On the other hand you have those that have just started to train over the past 12 months or more & for these young lifesavers just getting through their heat is like winning a gold medal it is very pleasing to see the smile on their young faces.

Over many years now the Swansea Belmont SLSC has been fortunate to have an abundance of Senior competitors coming through the dedicated & quality training programs developed in the Junior arena & along the way that can attract some from other clubs to bolster the squads which in turn provides a battleground for training thus pushing each competitor to strive for their ultimate goal under the clubs astute coaches. The club has seen more Australian Champions produced in the past 25 years than any other club in NSW, but that comes with consequences as it places many in the spotlight for opportunities to move north of the border into QLD, local clubs or other avenues, admittedly we are not the only club going through this in NSW.

This year the clubs senior competition team numbers have been reduced in all disciplines which now bring the club into an era of rebuilding our identity & attitude when training to inspire others to compete in the Green & Gold, there is a need to bring back our Nine Mile club spirit, become a unified tight nit team that supports each & everyone the same, we have the coaching systems in place our athletes need to raise the bar on their own standards & passion to move into the future glory days. Those that did compete during the year had fantastic results with many achieving a personal best at Branch, State & Nationals; our biggest highlights were Angela Leadbeatter winning Gold for her 3rd consecutive year in the Open 2Km Beach Run at North Kirra & Jack McGregor finishing 2nd at his first Aussie Titles in the Youth Championships U15 Board Race. A special mention must go to our evergreen Masters competitor Marilyn Clarence collecting 7 Gold medals + minor placing's. You can see the other results in the Surf Sports report.

The club has hosted many events during the season starting with the North Curl Curl SLSC annual Development Camp in October strengthening our interclub connections & training programs to develop the youth. Due to the bad surf conditions at Catho the NSW Interbranch Titles were moved to Blacksmiths near the breakwall opening up our club facilities & rescue equipment for use.



Each year we run the annual Kracka Ironperson providing our budding iron men & women enthusiast with an opportunity to showcase their skills & endurance then on the following day Lake Macquarie Games is inundated with both beach & water competitors striving to win a medal.

Our boating fraternity turn up in numbers for the Streets Boat Series round to pull their swimmers up & flex the muscles, rowing over many races then sharing a few laughs at the bar. In December the club & surrounds was transformed to host approximately 1000 kids & VIP's from around the world for the International Childrens Games working with the LMCC & Lifeguards our Patrol crews extended the flags to support the hundreds of kids that enjoyed our surf, many had not even seen the ocean before.

Fundraising whether it be selling raffle tickets at the local caravan parks, functions such as weddings & parties, BBQ's or Bands on a Sunday is a major part of every surf club to provide valuable dollars to purchase vital rescue equipment, club house infrastructure upgrades, competitor assistance for craft & touring team clothing, Presentation awards plus many other bills to keep the club functioning. Without the dedicated efforts from individuals within the club that set up small committees to ensure our major events like the annual Golf Day & Across the Lake Swim continue to flourish the club would struggle to survive, in saying that unfortunately this year the club acted on the advice from Waterways, Fisheries Department, Hunter & NSW SLS to cancel the 56th swim crossing of Lake Macquarie due to the unprecedented increase of large sharks that had been monitored along the swim coarse over many months - Safety of the Public & support personnel is our No.1 Priority. Fingers crossed we can return in 2016! The club is committed to support other fundraising awareness activity such as MND, Cure Brain Cancer that has touched some special members of our club & next season will include some additional awareness events on the calendar.

On the back of thankless hours of fundraising the club is indebted to our National & State Sponsors that generously support Surf Life Saving – DHL, Telstra, Dulux, SLS Foundation, SLS NSW and Clubs NSW. Locally Swansea Belmont SLSC is thankful for the funding via Government Grants, Lake Macquarie City Council, Belmont 16s, Pelican RSL, Lion Pty Ltd, Gunyah Hotel, Kracka Surfcraft, Cancer Council, Swansea Surf Shop, Valentine Tennis Club & the many other sponsors that help our club financially survive to provide the vital rescue equipment that makes Blacksmiths Beach safe.

During this season two Swansea Belmont Life Members were awarded the distinguished honour for their dedicated services to Surf Life Saving - Arch Salaris Hunter Branch Life Membership & Chris Paul Life Membership of SLS NSW. Congratulations & well done for your awards after many years of continued service.



On a sombre note the club had lost 4 members during the year & it was with great sadness on the 21st July 2015 that I had to inform our members of the passing of a former President, Life Member & Hunter Branch Life Member John "Macca" McDougall as he had succumbed to Brain Cancer. He was a great clubman who held many positions in our club & Hunter Branch over the years, his infectious bearded smile, empathy & advice too many will be sadly missed by all. Our other members to vale are Barry Dobb (Life Member). Lenny Jones & Bill McKenzie.

There are many new challenges ahead which we are working through & will achieve great outcomes as long as the club works together as a team. TREASURERS REPORT

The 2014/15 financial year was another year of solid financial performance from the Swansea Belmont SLSC. For the full year the club recorded a surplus before depreciation of \$33,433 which although down on the prior year is a very good results.

It is anticipated that much of this surplus will be spent prior to the commencement of the 2015/16 season with the purchase of a new IRB and an upgrade to amenities at the boatshed.

The club has a significant advantage in that is it not reliant on a narrow range of income sources. In 2014/15 its income was generated from:

- Bar & Function Income \$50k (25%)
- Grants, Sponsorship & Donations \$50k (25%)
- Membership Fees \$42k (22%)
- Fundraising, mostly raffles and the club's Golf Day \$31K (16%)
- Interest Income \$10k (5%)
- Other sources, particularly break wall maintenance and clothing sales \$14k (7%)

A feature of this year's income was the surplus from clothing sales, following significant losses in recent years.

Total expenditure for the year was \$164k, of which \$97k was on Lifesaving and Competition, which represented 58% of total expenditure and was an increase of \$34k on the prior year. Purchases of surfing equipment for both lifesaving and competition increased significantly from 2013/14.

Expenditure on both Facilities and Administration reduced for the prior year.

Other items of note during the year were the receipt of an \$8k donation from the Valentine Tennis Club and the absence of fundraising income from the Across the Lake Swim which was cancelled this year due to the suspected presence of sharks in the lake.

Annual Depreciation was yet to be determined at the time of publication, but is likely to be in the order of \$80k, including \$60k of depreciation on the clubhouse building. The following statements are Preliminary Financial Statements in that at the time of publication they are yet to be audited. Copies of the full audited Financial Accounts and Audit Report will be available at the AGM.



While the names change each year, one thing remains a constant; Swansea Belmont's junior activities has continued its long history of making a significant contribution to the youth of our community.

All club members, not just parents, shoulder a great responsibility in providing an environment where young people can come to enjoy themselves for Sunday morning Nippers, competition in surf sports, making friends and having fun. For over 40 years our club has seen the success of the junior activities in so many areas but most importantly in playing our part in the development of young people. This season was another where close to 300 children participated in our junior activities program and the smiles on their faces is testament to the effort of all who give their time for the benefit of the children.

Surf Lifesaving is a great tradition in this country and, while society continues to change surf lifesaving brings a structure to the education of children about the ocean. As parents, our primary responsibility in this regard is to ensure that our children are both confident and competent in the surf and our club's record for over four decades is surely second to none. What this requires though, is the involvement of parents in assisting running Sunday activities, attending fundraising events, doing water safety on normal Nipper days or at carnivals and, hopefully, taking on committee positons. Surf Lifesaving is a participation sport not a spectator sport and without the efforts of a small number of people the club would struggle to provide the successful environment for children that it does.

Each year we see strong numbers of new children come into Nippers at the younger ages but see a much smaller contingent move through to the senior ranks. While this is also a reflection of changes in society we all need to do our part to improve the retention of young adults in a movement that is centred on the community. The community aspect is the fundamental basis of surf clubs and is what everything we do is about.

In that regard it is always pleasing to see children achieve in both the surf education and competition aspects of Nippers and this year was no different. Each year children undertake structured educational training as well as water proficiency testing. These activities provide the core skills for junior lifesavers that Sunday activities and competition build upon. We train to ensure our skills are up to date and competition provides the avenue to test our lifesaving skills and ensure we are at our peak as lifesavers no matter what our age.



This year's NSW State competition result saw us lose the mantle of premier club in the Hunter that we'd had for quite some time but all is not lost. Strong performances from all our competitors was again the order of the day and while our ranks had thinned a little due to transfers out and some stellar performances by a small number of competitors at another Hunter club we had some great results to end up in 9th position in NSW. Perhaps the most pleasing aspect was to see some competitors achieve top spot in the State for the first time while those who'd been there before either made it again or were still in the points.

While it is the children who competed and achieved the great results every single one of them has, and it must be said that success is not just measured in gold medals, it is a fact that our club is unsurpassed in the calibre of our coaching staff. Accomplished athletes in their own right once again these people gave their time freely to every single child no matter where they sat on the ability scale at the time. So many children have achieved their potential thru the assistance of the coaching staff and on behalf of everyone I thank them sincerely. I do know though that this is a labour of love for them and the achievements of the children is their motivating factor.
