- 1928-29 Boat crew awarded Certificate of Bravery from the Royal Humane and Shipwreck Society for a rescue on the treacherous Swansea Channel bar

- 1936 Joe Charlton elected as the club's first Life Member

Bill was an Australian Champion Boat rower, a very competent, competitive swimmer and a reliable patrolling lifesaver.


He was part of our team that won the Australian Championship Point Score in 1950.

The trend in declining Club & Patrol Members has continued to impact on the clubs ability to rebuild on numbers per patrol which in turn escalates additional personal time to club directors on the phone when members are not turning up for rostered patrols & not arranging substitutes thus placing added patrol hours on a group of dedicated members. Majority of the time this was on a Saturday due to work commitments which is the growing trend in today's society & is something that Surf Lifesaving State & Branch bodies should seriously look at due to the Lifeguards already being on duty. Fortunately we managed throughout the summer season providing the minimum required members or above each weekend to ensure that our club maintained our Surf Lifesaving Service Agreement & Bronze Club Quality Program. Without a Director of Lifesaving during the year I must thank Nicole, Louise, Ron & Troy for their efforts in helping to provide valuable time assisting in the organisation & fulfilment of numbers to ensure our beach was opened for the public.

This team ensure all members are instructed competently & qualified to fulfil their duty whilst on patrol & in life generally, they now have the expertise to deal with any situations that arise whilst serving the public. Louise & her invaluable trainers have played a major role in our lifesaving awards revival over the past 2 years & obtaining our clubs sustainability targets. This team has worked tirelessly to increase our patrol member's education & ongoing award certificates, it would be great to see more parents getting behind their children & completing the Bronze Medallion so they too can help out our patrolling numbers & enjoy some family time at the beach in a patrol uniform with their child. Just because you did not grow up at the beach does not mean you cannot be a lifesaver, it is very self-rewarding to many parents that achieve their bronze & for some of them they have worked hard on learning to swim laps again & up skill on first aid to complete the course & not only show the children but themselves that anything is possible. Your calling card in the surf club might be as a trainer as we always need more. Our club is very fortunate to have such a dedicated team and their quality of training is not only highly regarded at our club but also within Hunter Branch.



Our clubs building committee have been in a drawn out process of renovating the Boat Shed over the past 8 months to include separate male & female shower/toilet facilities that will be beneficial to all ski & boat competitors, once again this has taken some time due to the lack of helpers sticking up their hand. Over the past 3 months the LMCC have knocked down the existing old Kiosk/Board & storage shed to build the new LMCC Lifeguards gear & first aid shed thus freeing up on completion for the club a back storage shed to house the Can-am ATV & our long awaited opportunity to build a kiosk downstairs opposite the caretaker room with other possible changes to the existing brick wall & surroundings in the long term. Big thanks to all those retired club members that have been lending a hand to complete the building works. We have just completed a Government Grant submission to provide solar power on the club roof that will eventually reduce our power bills & efficiency plus our building & finance committee have approved for the club to install ducted air conditioning to eventually make our upstairs function rooms comfortable in all weather conditions that will attract more functions to the club.

The club is always looking out for valuable sponsorship dollars to help cover the costs associated in the operation of the club, Swansea Belmont SLSC is grateful to our local sponsors such as LMCC, Belmont 16's, Pelican RSL, Swansea Workers, Kracka Surfcraft, Cancer Council, Swansea Surf Shop, Swansea Caravan Park, Blacksmiths Caravan Park, Port Waratah Coal & recently Andrew McGrath First National Real Estate coming on board to sponsor the Inaugural Nine Mile Ocean Swim that replaced our once again cancelled Across the Lake Swim. Thanks to Dave Pringle & Katrina Pasta for all the hours you put into processing and managing our financial information and reporting. It was pleasing to see the club has continued to return a profit and that we are in a sound financial position. To Bob Barnes & his team of warriors that maintain the Bar equipment & stock thanks for your effort in supplying quality product to the members & event patrons.

During this season Swansea Belmont Life Member Phil Cousins received his National Medal 3rd Clasp in recognition for his dedicated 45 years long service as a patrol member completing 30 hours or above each year. Congratulations & well done Phil for your award after many years of continued service you have amassed 151 hours patrolling this season alone. Unfortunately during the year we lost some more lifelong friends & members who will be sadly missed. In February our late Life Member Bill Behrends passed away aged 93. Neil McEwan husband of Janine, adored father to Cory and Jacqui succumbed to his motor neurone disease in March, his smiling face & dry jokes on Patrol 4 will never be forgotten & just recently Leoni Marsh, wife of Cliff & mother to Nicole, Benn & families, lost her brave battle of long term illness, we have many memories of Leoni supporting our club & her beautiful family, she will be sadly missed.

It would be remiss of me to finish without passing on a special mention to our IRB crews for all their effort during the year maintaining our most essential lifesaving equipment & ensuring that club water activities could proceed with you all having the ducks available & ready in the surf thus giving our junior members that safety blanket knowing you were out protecting them. Thank you Troy, Phil & the growing team hanging out in the duck shed.

After 12 long months of lobbying to get financial backing from Dantia Economic Group & LMCC assistance with land works & infrastructure it was announced at Umina in March that Swansea Belmont had secured the NSW State Titles in 2017 & 2018 with an option of a third term, that was the easy part, now the hard work begins to provide NSW lifesavers, spectators & sponsors the best Titles they have ever seen. We as a club need to pull together from junior's right through to our Life members & local community working side by side to put on the best event in the state. After the AGM we will start the process of putting in place an Organising Committee & arranging to have a meeting with the surrounding community to keep them up to date with the Event.

TREASURERS REPORT

Despite a reduction in revenue from the prior year, the 2015/16 financial year was another year of solid financial performance from the Swansea Belmont SLSC. For the full year the club recorded an operating surplus before depreciation of \$41,429 which is \$8,270 improvement on 2014/15.

The impact of a fall in revenue from the prior year of \$5,690 was more than offset by a \$13,962 drop in total expenses.

Positive features of this year's result were:

- Net proceeds from Bar & Functions of \$62,703 which now represent 33% of total income
- An increase in funds from members' breakwall maintenance work to \$10,000.
- An insurance recovery of \$15,135 to fund the repair of storm damage
- A reduction in expenditure on Lifesaving & Competition from \$95,866 in the prior year to \$86,549 as IRB equipment was upgraded in 2014/15. Lifesaving and Competition still constitute 58% of total expenditure.
- A reduction in Facilities expenses of \$7,544 due to a \$6,000 drop in electricity charges.

Adverse influences of the years result were:

- A fall in income from Grants, Sponsorship & donations from \$49,535 in the prior year to \$28,456. Last year benefited from a significant one-off donation from Valentine Tennis Club.
- A fall in Fundraising Income from \$31,081 to \$23,197 due largely to less raffle activity.

Approximately half of this surplus has been spent during the year on the purchase of a new All Terrain Vehicle (ATV) and an upgrade to amenities at the boatshed.

Annual depreciation was calculated at \$78,687 including a \$62,452 reduction in the carrying value of the clubhouse. After depreciation the club reported a net loss of \$37,258.





I was fortunate enough to be the first female in the club to gain the Qualifying Certificate, nowadays the SRC, followed a few years later with my bronze. Those early days of females in the club were challenging to say the least. Once I had my bronze, off to patrol I go & then obtained Advanced Resus & Instructor's Certificates. Had the pleasure of saving a life with mouth to mouth, or I should say mouth to beak, rescued our pet Bantam chook, Hilda from the pool after she had been attacked by a dog. Lucky I learnt resus, she survived & I made it into Surfline, the then surf life-saving magazine.



I enjoyed a stint on the committee as a young assistant secretary to the great Norman Jack Turney. R & R was a great part of our life & I treasure all the great memories & friendships. We followed the team, coached by Dad, all over the local, Sydney, State & Aussie carnivals.

Marriage & babies took me away for a while, returning with my family to nippers. Many Sundays were enjoyed from dawn to dusk at the beach. Committee life called again with stepping in to roles - junior delegate, assistant secretary then finally junior secretary. I even got Dad to have a stint at Age managing Martin's age group, much to his & the kids delight. Kids grow up so fast & before I knew it we were in seniors & enjoying the R& R arena again along with board & swim. Carnival entries became my forte, along with assisting Leanne Johnson in the secretary role, finally taking over from her in 2011 when she retired.

I've enjoyed my time as Secretary, it certainly is a very challenging role, but satisfying when you see the committee come together to do great things. The people you work with make it & many thanks to all who I have served on the committee with. We have run Endurance Champs, our 85th Anniversary Dinner, successful Presentation nights, Across the Lake Swim & battles with the ever increasing shark population, Nine Mile Classic, the junior events of Kracka & Lake Macquarie Games & now look forward to the State Champs.

Registrar's Report

Firstly, many thanks to the Committee and members of the Surf Club, for all their assistance.

We have 629 members this season, ranging from Juniors right through to the Senior level including Associates/Life Members.

A BIG THANK YOU to all the members who paid their fees early in the season, please remember no fee payment means no gym use and more importantly no insurance cover! So please everyone knows that each year a fee is involved – so come on pay the fee get it over with and be covered!

I did make mention last year, on a new requirement for each member involved with the children, to have to complete a "Working with Children Check". This requirement is now compulsory with the Office of the Children's Guardian now doing audits to make sure everyone that needs to obtain this clearance have done so. They will be imposing fines of up to \$10,000 to each member and to the club where they find that this requirement has been ignored.

Volunteers must go to:

<u>www.check.kids.nsw.gov.au</u> – complete and finalise the form, print it off and take your Application number to NSW Motor Registry with proof of identity. Once you receive your number, takes about 4 weeks to obtain, then you MUST give this number to the Club Registrar as your information must be first verified on the Working with Children's website and then placed in Surfguard. There is no cost and it lasts for 5 years.

Here are some statistics that show the high standards of lifesaving on Blacksmiths Beach, Breakwall, surrounding water ways & grounds. These statistics are put into Surfguard every week from the patrol log book that we should be completing diligently on every patrol.

Rescues – 8
Preventative Actions – 566
First Aid – 47
Beach Closed – 4
Beach Attendances – 26807
Patrol Hours – 4559

Our Patrol Captains have done a fantastic job once again showing professionalism & quick response to any incidences that have occurred such as Shark sightings, they have guided their patrolling members to manage the public's expectations & they have welcomed all new SRC & Bronze holders onto their patrols.

On a more serious note, our patrols have suffered this year from a decline in membership renewals, club transfers & patrol attendance due to work or other commitments. Non-attendance puts pressure on the remaining members of the patrol & on that handful of volunteers who are frequently called upon to relieve the pressure in these situations. 

First Aid Report

The first aid equipment is kept in the radio room for easy access except for the period after patrols on Saturday and after Sunday patrols when there is a long weekend. The reason we have been doing this is because there are more members with knowledge of the access code to the radio room than members with keys to the parking spot for the patrol van. Also, our early morning swimmers use these facilities so they are open early in the morning. Always remember that Mark Bint, our caretaker has keys to all parts of the Club if there is an emergency.

Thanks to a grant we also purchased a new "defib", which has been set up in the auditorium on the wall just before the Ladies' toilet. The "defib" has instructions in the case as well as the pads that can be used for babies and toddlers. Instructions are also included in the case for the use of these toddler pads. The patrol van's "defib" has also been updated and now has the pads for toddlers and babies. Theses have been placed in a clear plastic box in the patrol van that also includes spinal collars and the spinal straps. The Club has also purchased a new spinal board. Do you have relatives and friends that you care for? Are you not confident with first aid? Do you not know HOW to use some or all the equipment mentioned!!! The Club has run several first aid courses over the last few years but the numbers of members; especially patrolling members has been disappointing. Want to save a life? Want to save a loved one's life? Want to save your child's life or your grandparent's life. Do one of these courses.

Patrol Captains, do not forget to note in the patrol log any use of equipment or supplies used. If we don't know it's gone we cannot replace it.


