Passed away in Old Wallsend Hospital, his place of birth some 82 years ago.



I must thank our Club Directors & Management team for their dedicated voluntary hours throughout the season especially Katrina for your commitment to ensuring everything is completed on time. Your Management team continue to set sustainable goals, whilst getting closer to finalising others throughout the next 12 months with upgraded renovations planned. The positive direction in Patrols, Training and Education, Competition, Finance and Administration will ensure we have set the club up for future sustainable success in Surf Life Saving and support of the local community.

With another season of volunteer Beach Patrols completed & keeping our club breach free along with no lives lost whilst the red & yellow flags were flying is very satisfying, it's an opportune time to reinforce the most important responsibility we have here at Swansea Belmont that is to patrol our beach with quality rostered numbers during the season, and to ensure that it is a safe environment for all that visit so they get to go home to their families along with our voluntary members. The club management team would like to thank all our members that performed beach patrols this season & for continuing to uphold

the standards of the Aussie Surf Life Saver through some difficult conditions & busy periods on the beach. To our Patrol Captains, Vice-Captains, IRB crews and all water safety personnel I thank you for your dedicated service. Very special thanks to Dave Banks Director of Life Saving who is standing down from his position after 3 years due to work & family commitments, your dedication, direction and countless hours on the beach ensuring that our commitment to saving lives is professionally administered. Dave came back to help in a time of need for his 2nd stint & although you had no siblings in our club over the 3 years you certainly lead by example & can walk away knowing you have placed our patrol teams in a better position, especially for whoever steps up to take on the role In Dave's words "you can never not have enough surveys & spreadsheets to get an answer". Another big thank you must go to the permanent & part time Lake Macquarie City Council Lifeguards who excelled & engaged alongside our Patrol teams again this season.

Our Education and Training team have done a wonderful job this season, putting many members through an enormous range of courses. This is an important pillar within our Surf Club and one that we must continually work at to maintain the quality of patrols we currently have and pride ourselves on. We had 86 new awards this season with 33% of these members receiving an award for the first time. Awards achieved by our members were 12 Surf Rescue, 28 new Bronze Medallion, 5 Trainers, 4 Silver Medallion & 37 First Aid.

I look forward to more members upskilling their qualifications next season. It goes without saying that the training & education that our members receive is responsible for the skills that they possess, this is a monumental but important task, so many thanks to our Chief Training Officers Cat & Karen plus all the trainers who assisted in educating our members. Without your dedication our core activity of lifesaving would be hard to achieve & I thank you all for your ongoing efforts.

Three down one to go to complete our State Championships hosting agreement on Blacksmiths Beach with nothing but praise from SLSNSW & other clubs again for the magnificent showcase provided by our Workforce & Organising Committee. When you take on hosting the championships you require a combined club effort with all members & local community getting their hands dirty & giving up their time to pitch in & make it happen – so thank you to the best workforce in Australia!

It has been a long year of meetings with State & Lake Macquarie City Council consultation to continue our goal of creating a new improved venue with Stage 2 currently under construction on the northern beachfront clubhouse & upgrade to downstairs male & female changerooms over winter. Ultimately, we aim to create a wonderful refurbished venue over the next couple of years in stages for our members & the community to get the full experience of what our movement & particularly our club stands for. In keeping transparency for the members below is an outline of where we are at including costs.

On Tuesday 30 April 2019 the executive of Swansea Belmont SLSC unanimously endorsed a Master Plan for the following building works to commence at the club under the guidance of Project Manager Matt Chalmers:

Recently the Club received a Government Grant \$250K, special thanks to Terry Watts & Matt Chalmers for the submission.

 Webber Architects to complete the major Surf Club Renovation Concept Design & Development Application Documentation & Complete the final detailed design of the New Bar.

Total quoted price \$32,225 excluding GST

2. Deck and Ground Floor Addition

Gary Simpson building estimate to extend the deck, relocating of the external stairs, ground floor additions and associated works extension of the Gym eastern wall.

Total estimated price \$172,000 excluding GST.

3. Ground Floor Male and Female Upgrades

Separate Grant being applied for!
 As per detailed estimate for the ground floor male and female bathroom upgrades.

Total estimated price \$110,008 excluding GST.

4. Nipper Room and BBQ FacilityEstimate conveyed **\$150,000** excluding GST.

TOTAL Building Works approved = \$465,000* excluding GST

Many of our plans from the Building Committee are still on the waiting list to be started due to Council approval & grants but below is where we are currently at:

- Commencement of work in 2020 to new Kiosk under DA approval.
- LMCC to construct a Disabled Viewing Platform in front of Clubhouse.
- New DA Plans (per above endorsed plans) have been lodged to complete major renovations to the Internal & External building which include a new entrance into the club on southern side, external facade modifications, 3-way bar area to service all function areas upstairs, new entry to downstairs bar, new stairs & entry to back upstairs meeting/function room - 2020, new external stairs to back deck area, improved toilet facilities – 2019.

Our club continues to be in a healthy position financially and I thank Dave Pringle, Katrina Pastourmoglou & Neil Marshall for their watchful eye over the finances. All the arduous work by members over State Titles, Sunday Bar Sessions, Functions & Fundraising events build up the funds, so the club management team & sub committees can plan to refurbish club furniture, equipment plus the major renovations to ensure your club is modern & a destination that the community want to hold a function within.

Our Social Committee keep raising the bar providing quality entertainment each Sunday over the summer months & have been well supported by our local community & members. In November the club held our inaugural Melbourne Cup luncheon that proved to be a successful event with the Auditorium filled with 110 attendees enjoying the racing, fashion show from local business Harlow St & live entertainment into the evening. Our club season launch will be opened on 26th October featuring "All Access 80" & Lisa Hunt in December, these are our major music fundraisers that require members to support. Our golf enthusiast will once again attack the Belmont Golf Course in October without much success due to the constant verbal barrage & loose ball striking generally caused by the social beers, another event that raises plenty of money thanks to Chad Griffith & crew. More help is required in organising our club functions & events. Please don't leave it up to the same people, put your hand up & lighten the load thanks.

We have had to face sadness again during the season with the loss of our members – Peter McGregor, Chris Robinson, Jim Aspley & Robert "Babe" Heaney. Any club with a reasonably long history only reaches the heights that it does by standing on the shoulders of great men & women who have come before.

It was a challenging year for me personally but one that has also helped me grow a lot as a leader & learn a lot as a club mate and human being, I must thank my wife Mel for her enduring support & patience along with the guidance Chad has provided dealing with some difficult issues. Thank you to Lake Macquarie City Council for their continued support of the club through an annual donation of \$12,000 for surf club maintenance.

Swansea Belmont SLSC – 2018/19 Financial Report

The two following pages set out the financial performance of Swansea Belmont SLSC for the year ended 30 April 2019 and the financial position as at 30 April 2018.

These pages were prepared prior the finalisation of the annual audit but are unlikely to change in any material way.

Operating Results

The year was financially another very good year for the club, reporting an Operating Profit Before Depreciation of \$265,501. The major factors in this result were:

- Grant Receipts of \$111,199
- Net Income from holding the NSW State Titles of \$98,937
- Net Bar and Functions Income of \$64,691

There were also a number of other significant areas of income shown in the attachments all of which contributed to the successful outcome. Most of this income is the result of the continued and consistent efforts of members and supporters.

Total Operating Expenses for the year totalled \$184,113 of which \$101,693 was spent on Lifesaving and Competition activities. The balance comprised the payment of utilities and maintenance of facilities (\$54,810) and general administration activities (27,610).

Capital Expenditure

Much of \$111,199 of grant income received during the year was in relation to capital works involving clubhouse renovations. The club spent a total of \$153,840 on capital works during the year, most of which involved those renovations.

Financial Position

At the end of the year the club had Net Assets of \$3,000,000. Of this amount, \$760,775 was held in financial assets and the balance is largely the holding value of the clubhouse and facilities. The club is in a strong financial position to fund further clubhouse upgrading planned to commence in 2019/20.

Director of Lifesaving Report

Director of Lifesaving David Banks



I continue to be humbled by the contributions of so few to support so many when it comes to protecting our swimming public, supporting and upholding the values of our club and the historical name of Surf Life Saving in Australia.

We have maintained a presence on the beach at every major SLS event in our area and supported not only our patrols, but broadened our scope to assist other water based events in our region, which is recognition of the value we provide to our beach going public and competitors alike.

This season we had our fair share of windy wet days, however the lingering summer feeling continued to the end with patrols enjoying warm weather to see the season out.

Patrol stats.

I talk about the numbers, they provide us with some indicators and trends on our performance and the direction we are heading, however more importantly they tell us about the people who put in the hard work to achieve not only the results but to achieve the reason we are here.

This year we saw introduction of Australia Day volunteer patrol, this combined with a well supported Christmas Day patrol and the State Carnival patrols saw our voluntary hours increase, which also indicates the depth of support in the club for dedication to Life Saving.

The alarming change is the increase in NO SHOW events across our patrolling season. There are many potential reasons behind the change, I am sure if you ask 10 different people you will receive 10 different answers. Our commitment is to find ways to better engage members on flexible working routines, align patrols to better meet the demands of an increasing competition season across all disciplines and encourage our members to seek substitutes and give back when available for alternate patrols.

This season we increased our number of all-day patrols with a small number of patrols trialing the all-day format for the second half of the season. The feedback from these patrols has been favorable to the point the post season feedback has been to continue the all-day rostering and it was fun, enjoyable, improved team bonding and provided Patrol Captains with flexibility when managing patrol numbers across the day allowing members to attend when available, whilst maintaining our Service Agreement.

In reviewing our membership levels in support of patrols, it is evident we need to work towards recruiting and encouraging more members to support our teams. Of the 409 members of patrolling age (and some beyond) we have 147 members actively patrolling. In contrast we have 210 associates, who also contribute to the club in many ways, who could also consider patrols as part of their service to the community.

Please consider the fact that you can participate in patrols and patrol activities as an award member, providing valuable skills and knowledge to the general public, which may inspire you to take up your bronze qualification as you gain skills and knowledge and enjoy the comradery of patrol.

It's no secret we are challenged by the busy lives of, those of our families and the demand from our employers. The current patrol roster cannot survive in its current form, the break between patrols is generally to short, some teams are spread way to thin and the required skill base to allocate more patrols with less numbers is not sufficient to simply make more patrols. This season we continued to develop potential leaders in some of the larger patrols to the stage we can now start moving members onto their own new patrols and create new friendships and broaden the skill base of our patrols, this should also include strengthening of other patrols that have suffered a reduction in members over the season.

The post season patrol survey has received 69 individual responses at the time of writing, thank you to all who responded. We also received responses from members who will be new to the club patrol roster next season, so a big welcome to you as well. The results are:

60 – Yes I will be patrolling next season

5 – No I will not be patrolling next season

4 – Please ask me again, as I am still interested

A great head start for planning next season

Our club still remains at the leading edge of training equipment technology and delivery of education in Surf skills and knowledge. I encourage all members to promote the benefits of being an active member in the surf life saving movement, the skills, knowledge and leadership gained in the service of our community bode well on any resume to a potential employer.

The patrol van escaped an upgrade again this season, however Charmo has graciously accepted the task of reviewing the concept drawings to provide us with some more ideas and plans to engage a fabricator. With a well equipped van, all day to soak in the beach

life and your friends on patrol, why not be on patrol and enjoy the very best our country has to offer. Yes, of course the refurbished van will have a BBQ.

To finish up, in comparison to the great history of this club and the lifetime of contribution of our long serving members I am but only a nipper with aspirations of serving like those before me. It has been a great season, our patrolling members have supported our beach going public with vigilance and dedication. May I see all of you on the sand again next season.



I've enjoyed my first season as IRB captain which has only been possible through your support.

Unfortunately, timing and weather have been against us this season and we have failed to complete an IRB Drivers and an IRB Crewpersons course, I apologise to those keen members who we have let down in this regard. I am looking to rectify this and bolster the number of available drivers and crews next season.

In closing, I would like to invite all active bronze members to gain their Drivers and Crewpersons Awards and join us on the water. These awards are enjoyable to get and highly valued by the club. If you are interested in gaining these awards please make contact with the Education Team, Club Captain or the IRB Captain.

We did have several cases where those trained with First Aid certificates, Defibrillator and Advanced Resuscitation Techniques showed the need we have for members to do that extra training. These patrol members are so valuable to their patrols and to the Club in general.

If you are interested in doing any "higher" awards please let our training Ladies know so they can organise courses. Cat and Karen and previous Chief Instructors have offered these courses but have not had volunteers for the awards. Think about doing these awards. It could help your patrol, your work "mates" and your family. Perhaps, even more money in your pay. Most employers love having employees who have those extra first aid qualifications.

Our Director of Lifesaving has continued to update out

First Aid equipment. We have extra first aid kits as well as a third defibrillator. One is placed in the auditorium. **DO you know HOW to use it?** Check out the equipment next time you are on patrol. Know what is in the kits as it makes it easier when treating a patient. The kits are now more specific for surf life saving needs but you may think there is a need for other items that would be handy so please let me know. If you notice things missing, preferably when stocks are just running low rather than gone, please let me know so these items can be replaced.
