Barry Moses-An Outstanding Club Member

Chris Paul (Club Historian) and I spent a few very enjoyable hours recently with Barry & wife Val at their home in Belmont and have prepared these notes to share with members.

Barry gained his Bronze Medallion with Swansea-Belmont SLSC on 12th October, 1948. Ken Donnelly, Kevin Byrnes and Vic Convery were among the clubs' instructors at the time. The other members of Barry's bronze medallion squad were Allan Dixon, Tom Hadfield, Bill Osmond, Fred Presbury, Les Ross and Adrian 'Toby' Thompson. Barry went on to get obtain his instructors certificate in on 26th February,1950. At the time the club had a very short list of members, with even fewer instructors, however there were signs that membership was going to rise at a great rate, which it did.

Barry was Treasurer of the club from 1952 to 1956 and was heavily involved in the financing and building of the old wooden club house which was located near the playground at the entry to the current cark park. Finance was hard to get in those days but Barry was instrumental in raising funds etc for the project. With the financial & materials help of Jim Aspley (Belmont Timber Yard) - his employer at the time - Barry along with 15 or so members of the club including Keith Paul, Toby Thompson, Fred Moody, Vic Convery and others spent many Sundays all day (with the reward of a can of beer at the end of the day) to build the clubhouse. The building which was our base for lifesaving activities until the development of our current clubhouse in early '70's.

Barry was part of the club's support crew at the 1949/50 Aussies at Coolangatta where the club won the double (Junior & Senior) boat titles which gave Swansea-Belmont enough points to win the overall pointscore, the trophy for which is still in the clubhouse. At the time the Australian Championship program was a very basic one, consisting of only about twenty events.

Two of Barry's brothers have also figured prominently as members of Swansea-Belmont. Robert was the 1962 NSW Pillow Fight Champion, and Ron, better known as 'Jake', a champion surf swimmer. Son Greg, who unfortunately is no longer with us, was a champion swimmer who joined the club as a 6yr old. Greg was one of our most talented swimmers at the time. As a youngster he was a participant in our first 'Across the Lake Swim'.


As a former club Treasurer Barry has always been keenly interested in the financial viability of the club, so much so that donations of recent years from Barry and Val are recognised as the most significant in our history. Barry married Val on 20th November, 1954 he still remembered the date! - a Cessnock girl at the time. Val has memories of forever chasing him around the beach to find him as he was always busy with the club and club activities.

Barry and Val have been very successful business people. When Barry left the JH Aspley Timber Yard (located in Singleton St near the present Café Macquarie) he and Val bought the Belmont Newsagency which they ran for many years, went on to own both the Toronto Hotel and the Mattara Hotel at Charlestown and finally Val owned and ran the Darryl Lea chocolate and card shop located on the highway in Belmont. Barry and Val have lived most of their lives in Belmont with a stint at Coal Point.

Barry was part of a very active committee which ran the club in the struggling years until the late1950's when a new crew including Harry Walton, Jim Charlton and Cliff Marsh, among others, became involved in the club's administration. But Barry has always involved the surf club in his life. He was awarded Life Membership in 1975 and still cherishes his attendance at all of our major functions, including our AGM's, along with a keen group of "super-veterans".

All members should take some time to spend with this great clubman and recognise the vital contributions that both Barry and Val have made over the years.

It is with immense pleasure that I present my 6th Annual Report for the 2019/2020 surf season on behalf of Swansea Belmont SLSC. I must thank our Club Directors & Management team for their dedicated voluntary hours throughout the season especially during the back end of the season leading the club thru the COVID-19 pandemic ensuring all our members & guest safety was 1st priority. The positive direction in Patrols, Training and Education, Competition, Finance and Administration will ensure we have set the club up for future sustainable success in Surf Life Saving and support of the local community.

The club management team would like to thank all our members that performed beach patrols this season & for continuing to uphold the standards of your club through some difficult conditions & busy periods on the beach keeping our club breach free along with no lives lost whilst the red & yellow flags were flying is very satisfying, it's an opportune time to reinforce the most important responsibility we have here at Swansea Belmont that is to patrol our beach with quality rostered numbers during the season, and to ensure that it is a safe environment for all that visit so they get to go home to their families along with our voluntary members. A special thanks to Cat for your over & above efforts organising the patrol teams &

equipment. A big thank you must go to the permanent & part time Lake Macquarie City Council Lifeguards who excelled & engaged alongside our Patrol teams again this season.

Our Education and Training team have done a wonderful job again this season, putting many members through an enormous range of courses & stella training. We had 309 new awards this season with 41% of these members receiving an award for the first time. Awards achieved by our members were 227 Junior Surf Ed, 26 Surf Rescue, 21 Bronze Medallion, 1 Trainer, 2 Silver Medallion IRB & 13 First Aid (could not run 2nd course due to COVID), 9 IRB Crew, 8 Spinal & 2 Silver Medallion Beach Management.

It goes without saying that the training & education that our members receive is responsible for the skills that they possess, this is a monumental but important task, so many thanks to our Chief Training Officer Karen plus all the Trainers & Assessors who assisted in educating our members. Without your dedication our core activity of lifesaving would be hard to achieve & I thank you all for your ongoing efforts.

Competition in our club continues to raise the bar within the competitor ranks pushing themselves at training to the limit striving to excel in all disciplines under the watchful eyes of the club coaches. To our Sectional Coaches & Surf Sports Director Leanne Johnson, I must congratulate them on their leadership & outstanding work ethic over the season, this is a testament to their dedication and commitment helping the club competitors continued success in the Surf Sports arena. Although this season was cut short, you were very lucky to have competed at State Titles winning many medals & a top 10 finish again before the COVID shut down. To those competitors that went on to represent at higher levels well done!

Four down & now one more to go to after being approached by SLS NSW at the eleventh hour to ease some pressure on them due to circumstances beyond their control, so it was a no brainer to say yes & keep the Championships on the best host beach in NSW. Again, I cannot thank our Workforce & Organising Committee enough for the commitment & dedication you provide to ensure another successful carnival is conducted with all participants, families & Officials enjoying the experience – so thank you to the best workforce in Australia!

The club building works projects for a new Nipper Room & BBQ Facility plus upstairs Internal/External Bar set down over winter this year hit a hurdle & was forced to be put on hold due to LMCC not approving the DA because our Club Lease has not been agreed or signed off over the past 2 years (basically been a hand shake deal using our old lease during this period) with your Executive not happy with the Lease Agreement offered by LMCC. Negotiations are continuing between LMCC, Hunter Branch & we have now engaged SLS Aust Hon Solicitor to deal directly to ensure a fair & equitable 21 year lease is offered. So, I hope this will be resolved quickly & we can move forward with future projects. The club is looking to engage with our 2 local MP's & Mayor Fraser to hold a meeting to get them involved with our new club house designs that will involve a major face lift to the external & internal building per below:

- Commencement of work in 2020 to new Kiosk under DA approval Pushed out 2021/22.
- LMCC to construct a Disabled Viewing Platform in front of Clubhouse – Completed July 20.

- New DA Plans (plus per above endorsed plans) are waiting to be lodged to complete major renovations to the Internal & External building which include a new entrance into the club on southern side, extend Auditorium out onto the front deck with Bi-fold windows, external facade modifications, 3-way bar area to service all function areas upstairs, new entry to downstairs bar, possibly move Radio Room up to a 3rd Level to open up the Auditorium with a view to the South Pushed out 2021/22/23.
- Upgrade & Disabled ramp to downstairs Disabled Toilet & Gym entrance TBC 2020.
- New external stairs to back deck area, improved toilet facilities Completed 2019.
- New Club Mobile Vehicle Club currently chasing Grant.

Our club continues to be in a healthy position financially & I thank Dave Pringle, Katrina Pastourmoglou & Neil Marshall, Craig Wallis, Peter Scanes for their watchful eye over the finances. We are under great pressure to service a developing club financially & some decisions taken by the Board & Finance team are difficult ones but must be made. The membership can be assured this board has the club's financial responsibilities under control.

Our Social Committee have continued to keep the finances ticking over with entertainment each Sunday over the summer months which has been well supported by our local community & members. Melbourne Cup luncheon was a smash hit again with numbers up on the day that stops the nation, Lisa Hunt lifted the club roof again with a sell-out crowd entertained into the evening. Some call it golf others are there to provide the entertainment on magnificent Belmont Golf Course in October at our major fundraiser which keeps getting better each year, so thanks Chad & to all teams attending & digging deep into your pockets.

Swansea Belmont SLSC – 2019/20 Financial Report

The two following pages set out the financial performance of Swansea Belmont SLSC for the year ended 30 April 2019 and the financial position as at 30 April 2018.

These pages were prepared prior the finalisation of the annual audit but are unlikely to change in any material way.

Operating Results

The year was financially another very good year for the club, reporting an Operating Profit Before Depreciation of \$423,632. The major sources of income being:

Grants income of \$287,727 including \$250,000 towards clubhouse renovations

Net income from holding the NSW State Titles of \$97,345

There were also a number of other significant areas of income shown in the attachments all of which contributed to the successful outcome. Most of these activities were the result of the continued and consistent efforts of members, volunteers and our generous supporters.

Total Operating Expenses for the year total \$172,156 of which \$98,412 was spent on Lifesaving and Competition activities

Capital Expenditure

The club increed capital expenditure of \$468,950 during the year, which included \$373,750 on clubhouse renovations as well as the purchase of anew surf boat and gym equipment.

Financial Position

At the end of the year the club had Net Assets of \$3,392,185. Of this amount, \$645,696 was held in financial assets and \$2,426,279 comprising holding value of the clubhouse and facilities.

Registrar's Report

The 2019-2020 season had registration numbers fairly stable from the previous season. We have a total of 737 members this season, an increase from the 728 in 2018-2019 and 667 in 2017-2018.

Those increase in numbers came mainly through the juniors which went up from 292 in 2018 to 305 in 2019. We have 59 members in the u-15- U21 category of which 38 compete for the club. Over the last few years this number has been rising in this senior age group and we are now the strongest club in the region with our ski, boat & board sheds at capacity. I expect this number to rise again this coming season with many of the under 14's moving into the senior ranks. The rest of the memberships being made up in the active patrolling members, associates, honorary members & life members.

A BIG THANK YOU to all the members who paid their fees early in the season, it spreads out a very big workload. Gym keys are available at \$25 to active members in the club.

Working with children numbers are still in force this year for age managers, coaches, parents who help out at nippers and officials. These checks last 5 yrs. Note: The Children's Guardian has extended all WWCC clearances that were due to expire from 26 March 2020 to 26 September 2020 for a further six months. The six-month period applies from the date of the person's current expiry date

Director of Lifesaving Report

Director of Lifesaving Cat Gocher



Thank you to 12 Swansea Belmont patrols for an excellent season providing patrol services at Swansea Belmont SLSC, Blacksmiths Beach. It was a season like no other. We maintained a presence on the beach at every major SLS event and patrolled in full capacity on Blacksmiths Beach. Our extended lifesaving services was a feature of the patrolling membership this season as we not only covered our own beach but also support other community initiatives with marshalling, first aid and food stations for such events. However, from March 27th, 2020, effective immediately, all patrols by volunteer surf lifesavers on NSW beaches were cancelled for the remainder of the 2019/20 season. This unprecedented decision was made to protect the safety and welfare of volunteer surf lifesavers from potential infection by the COVID-19 virus and to support the Government's position in discouraging large gatherings of people on beaches across NSW. Despite patrol cancellations Swansea Belmont SLSC patrolling members maintained adequate lifesaving response capability along the NSW coastline through the Emergency Club Call Out Team ready for any emergency response and assigned tasks. In addition, Brad Fox continued Unmanned Aerial Vehicle (UAV) drone surveillance operations, with UAV pilots monitoring beach conditions, marine creature activity and assisting with search and rescue operations. As SLSNSW UAV operators can work alone, adhering to social distancing guidelines, while providing very effective beach and coastline surveillance, I'm sure Brad enjoyed his solitude on the beach.

I would like to thank the members of SBSLC who generously gave time out of their busy lives to keep the lifesaving function rolling and ensured our patrols were well supported. This awesome team has made my job so much easier, thanks to their dedication and willingness to roll up their sleeves and get involved whenever the Club needs a lifesaving presence.

It was time for Swansea Belmont to have a fresh start in the 2019/2020 season with the newly appointed 12 fully qualified patrols. This saw a decrease in the number of patrols by 25% but an increase in the uniformity of numbers in each patrol. Each patrol team was carefully considered in terms of friendships, family connections, junior nipper and senior carnival commitments, surf boat carnivals and award strength. As a result, the social media messaging for substitutes that plagued us all last season, was reduced by 99.9%. Only one member posted a message requesting a substitute. Congratulations Patrol teams in your outstanding organisation to cover your patrolling commitment.

On average, in the previous season, members were rostered on for $10 \times 1/2$ days (4.5hrs) totalling 45hrs. The new full day rosters introduced this season, committed members to a minimum of 4 days (8hrs) = 32hours + 3hrs min on a public holiday. This was a decrease of 6 extra days on the beach and 10hrs less patrolling.

Each patrol was fattened up and originally had between 10 and 17 patrolling members. 66% of patrols had at least 13 patrolling members. This ideally meant that patrols could self-regulate each all-day patrol in terms of shifts and hours patrolled to suit members challenged by busy lives, family commitments and the demand from employers. Those members that sacrificed 4 full days and time on their rostered public holiday would have received 100% patrol attendance. Corona Virus has managed to mess up those statistics.

Public holidays were divided into ½ days and 2 patrols were rostered. The 2 patrols were supported by a pool of >20 members that could cover the 8hr shift. Other public holidays such as Christmas Day, New Year's Day, Australia Day and Anzac Day have continued to be on a volunteer basis. Thank you to

those wonderful members who volunteered time on these days and congratulations to the lucky winners drawn for the \$150 hamper thank you gifts.

This season we also introduced patrolling members of the month. I continue to be humbled by the extra contributions of so few to support so many when it comes to protecting our swimming public, supporting and upholding the values of our club and the historical name of Surf Life Saving in Australia. Whether it be overhauling the patrol van, gaining extra awards, assisting with proficiencies, maintaining equipment or just showing enthusiasm for surf life-saving, patrolling members received a combination of vouchers from Blacksmiths Family Meats, Blacksmiths Home Timber and Hardware, Orana Hotel, Bowling Holey Moley, Bistro 801 Belmont Golf Club, Zarafer Coffee and Hoyts Charlestown.

In reviewing our membership levels in support of patrols, it is evident we need to work towards recruiting and encouraging more members to support our teams. The current required skill base in our patrol teams cannot survive in its current form. This season we continued to develop potential leaders in broadening the skill base of our patrols and we will be introducing the IRB crew certificate as a mandatory component of the Bronze award. In addition, I am looking to introduce a point system for those members who upskill in Surf Life Saving awards. The more points you have, the less hours you have to patrol. We are in dire need of IRB drivers, silver medallion, IRB crew, spinal and advanced ARTC. This upskilling will spread the workload across your patrols and thus require less hours if fewer patrolling members are experienced in all required areas of sustainability.

The season highlights included keeping our rescue numbers at one only, and I believe this is a direct result of the vigilance and proactive patrolling of Blackies Beach. This was particularly important this season, as we had so many beautiful sunny days with an increasingly multicultural crowd during those warmer months. On those days, preventing inexperienced beach users getting into danger, is absolutely critical. Below are some statistics from this season:

- x Maintained 12 patrols
- x 5,588.91 patrol hours
- x 32,126 estimated beachgoers
- x 1 rescue
- x 97 first aid treatments

- x 73 preventative actions
- x 14 beach closed days (due to CoVid 19)

I would like to thank our patrol captains for their active leadership and guidance throughout the season. We had five new patrol captains – Myles Geddes, Shane Dowsett, Jye Pastourmoglou, Jeff Kingston and Andrew McCallum. All of you must be commended for the amazing job you did in your first season as new patrol captains. In fact, your outstanding contributions means automatic captaincy for the next season.

I have endeavoured to get down on the beach this season and chat with every patrol. I have met some wonderful characters whose reputation preceded them and now is concrete. I have valued your feedback and taken on board some great suggestions. So, as I formally close-out my 1st season, as Director of Lifesaving (Club Captain) I thank each and every one of our Club members for your friendship and support. I am already looking forward to next season and am confident it will be just as busy for our patrolling members, but I am confident we will be up to the task!

Director of Education's Report

Director of Education Karen Lucas

Thank you to all our fabulous members who stepped up to train in new awards for the 2019/2020 season. There are 82 new awards this season and interestingly 26% of these members were receiving surf life-saving awards for the very first time and 9 of these Swansea Belmont members are not competing and simply training so they can volunteer as patrolling lifesavers and parent helpers at Nippers.

All our trainers have worked hard this season to offer several courses. During the season, Swansea Belmont, along with the entire Hunter's 13 Branches and a few other select clubs from around the state was invited to participate in a Pilot Program for Surf Lifesaving's core awards, The Bronze Medallion and Surf Rescue Certificate. This Pilot course gave Surf Life Saving a chance to review its Delivery and assessment of these awards. Our club's participation and feedback on the course content and delivery will vastly improve how our members will be educated in the future and will be rolled out during the 2020/21 Season.

Primarily the SRC will focus on water-based rescue skills and resuscitation incorporating the relevant units of competency from the Bronze Medallion. This will reduce repetition and give a clearer pathway between the 2 courses. A new interactive manual will be accessible online via an app. This will include instructive videos and interactive images. Any changes to the content can then be updated via the app to make sure the latest information is always accessible. Clearer guidance on how self-paced learning integrates with and still compliments face to face sessions and will ensure we are making the best use of trainers and participants time. You will see an increased focus on scenario-based learning and assessment to help trainers and participants more effectivity bringing together their skills they have learnt. A re-introduction of an 'on the job' component to better prepare the participants for their time on

Theses have been placed in a clear plastic box in the patrol van that also includes spinal collars and the spinal straps. The Club has also purchased a new spinal board.

The Club has run several first aid courses over the last few years but the numbers of members; especially patrolling members has been disappointing. Want to save a life?
