President's Report

It is with immense pleasure and some sadness that I present my 9th and last Annual Report for the 2022/2023 surf season on behalf of Swansea Belmont SLSC. I must thank our Club Directors & Management team for their dedicated voluntary hours throughout the season ensuring our finances, education, training, patrol teams & facilities were best in class for our community. Delivering tangible value to members is about looking beyond the features & benefits of membership to the positive & powerful outcomes you generate for the members. If you put your hand up to help around the club this past season — I thank you from the bottom of my heart.

Once again, our patrolling teams gave up their weekends & public holidays to support the public that attended our pristine sands working side by side with the Council Lifeguards ensuring "no lives lost" while our teams were on guard ensuring the public attending Blacksmith Beach travelled home safely from our shores. We are a club with many families who wear the red and yellow proudly keeping our beaches and community safe — thank you!

Thank you to all trainers & accessors. We had 478 new awards this season. Awards achieved by our members were 394 Junior Surf Ed, 18 Surf Rescue, 18 Bronze Medallion, 2 Silver Medallion Aquatic Rescue, 3 IRB Driver, 33 First Aid, 5 IRB Crew, 3 ART & 2 Silver Medallion Beach Management.

The Senior Club continues to shine at all levels of competition all over Australia thanks to the club's dedicated voluntary coaching staff who train our competitors to the minute to be "the best they can be". A very successful State Championships at Queenscliff and then the long trek across to Scarborough Beach WA, taking on the best and like all competitions some very happy members achieving their best or others coming home with the thoughts of what they need to do to take the next step up to be around the medals. Once again, the club came away with a swag of medals and I congratulate our latest Green Jacket recipients. We are a club that holds a great pool of talented competitors that work together as a team with a strong driving force to be successful as a unit and not just individually.

A big shout out to our members who took time off work to attend the Singleton Floods in July 2022 working alongside the SES/Police Rescue/Fire Brigade/RFS and other Hunter Branch Surf Clubs, our crews successfully rescued around 35 civilians & evacuated a further 60 from their homes plus a sick baby and mother on sunset outside the allowed time zones

on the water that the world witnessed on TV. On top of this they were delivering medical supplies, food, fuel back into the evac zones, cutting fences to allow cattle to wade up to higher grounds. The team were doing about 12–14-hour days so thanks – Lee Archer, Shane Dowsett, Mal Rae, Andrew McCallum, and Graham Burge. The feedback received from the Area Commander at Singleton SES was exemplary and they will be requesting SBSLSC to be working alongside if ever required in the future. Other flood deployments were solo missions by Kyle Probert to Walgett/Brewarrina and Andrew also attended the Gunnedah situation.

Another year another dead end on finalising a Club Lease, this has now been going on since 2015/16, we will continue to hold our stance of not agreeing to sign until the one-sided maintenance schedules and financial requirements change for a more equitable shared lease that acknowledges the work and respect that surf clubs are "Emergency Services" not just cash cows. This continues to impact our ability to move forward on our next major projects that have been in the pipeline over previous years.

No doubt our members are aware of the current pressures LMCC is placing on the club due to Fire Safety and Risk Management defect issues that have been identified by LMCC since the Fire Safety Standards changed in 2022. we have been targeted due to having a "Live in Caretaker" that LMCC are opposed to and have informed us that they do not want a residential occupancy in the future. Chad and I will exhaust every avenue for our rights and utilise external help from SLSA Solicitors and Crown Lands to maintain a Caretaker onsite as he is currently in temporary accommodation. Our first priority is to get all Fire Safety Risk issues completed for the safety of all members and public to attend their community clubhouse under revised operating hours for 3 months, our future operational activities will change as SBSLSC requires a dedicated Fire Warden onsite completing risk assessment duties following our Club Risk Management Plan Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) that they will be inducted to perform this role. The Club will be inducting several members who attend the club regularly (ie, Bar Staff) or hold Management positions (Secretary, Finance, Building Committee, Coaches, IRB team, Education & Lifesaving team etc.) who are required to attend the club to perform their role. A big thanks to Matt Chalmers and Chad Griffith for the behind-the-scenes work taking place to get our responses and internal defect risk items fixed and comply with standards.

The club continues to be in a healthy financial position with a very good operating turnover and profit due to increased functions, social events – Golf Day and Kracka, fundraising and investments in Term Deposits and Exchange Trading Funds. Outside of this, we are very fortunate to receive kind donations from club benefactors each year to upgrade rescue equipment.

We have had to face sadness again during the season with the loss of our Life Member (1973) Jim Corkett he was Club Captain 1972-73. Bryce Williams a great mate to all who met him received his Green Jacket winning the 2008 U19 Australian Surf Board Riding Championship. Other long-time members are Roy Broadbent 1952 Australian Junior Boat Champion and Kevin Wolfenden.

To run a successful club, you need the help and support of your Board of Directors, and I am indebted to all who have worked tirelessly alongside me over the past 9 years. I thank you all for helping guide our club to the heights it has reached and appreciate the thankless workload you volunteered your personal time to undertake.

Katrina, where do I start. The amount of time and your commitment to myself and this club is phenomenal. You have been a constant rock and a big reason I have been able to continue to be in this role for a long period of time. Your constant support and always able to lend a hand with anything I ask and more importantly a strength of support to my wife and family of girls I will always be indebted to you.

Treasurer's Report

The following two pages set out the financial performance of Swansea Belmont SLSC for the year ended 30 April 2023 and the financial position as at 30 April 2023. These pages were prepared prior the finalisation of the annual audit but are unlikely to change in any material way.

Operating Results

The year was financially another very good year for the club, reporting an Operating Profit Before Depreciation of \$198k. This is \$126K higher the surplus reported in the prior year, largely due to:

- Increased Catering and Function Income partly due to COVID restrictions in the prior year - \$68k increase
- Fundraising Income increased due to the efforts of a large number of club members -\$34k increase.
- Investment Income was an improvement on the prior year as the Exchange Traded Funds were held for a full 12months and interest rates on term deposits have increased.
 - \$33k increase

A breakdown of the results and variances from the prior year is shown in the following Income Statement.

Capital Expenditure

The club incurred capital expenditure of \$82k during the year much of which was funded by grants from the NSW Office of Sport and SLSA. These payments are not included in the Operating Profit.

Financial Position

At the end of the year the club had Net Assets of \$3,460k, mostly comprising:

- Property, Plant & Equipment (mostly clubhouse) \$2,458k and
- Financial Assets of \$958k including
- o TermDepositsof\$351kand
- o Exchange Traded Funds (ETF's) of \$487k

Investment Reserves

It was agreed at the 2021 AM that the club should invest up to \$500K in Exchange Traded Funds (EFT's) with a view to increasing the return on accumulated funds over the medium to long term. These funds were invested in a diversified portfolio of ETF's in the knowledge that although over time there should be increased profitability the club could expect to incur losses one year in five.

The club began investing in November 2021 as existing term deposits matured and had invested the full amount by March 2022. Since the start of the Investment the club has received dividends of \$29k which has been transferred out of the reserve to general funds.

The investment has however incurred an unrealised loss of the paper value of the assets of \$12K.

Full details are shown in the following pages.

It was also agreed at the 2021 AGM that any transfer of funds to or from the Reserve should only occur after a vote at a General Meeting of members. Apart from the transfer of dividends (less brokerage fees). The Directors do not propose any transfer of funds at this stage.

Director of Life Saving's Report

What a season hey ... This season delivered some of the greatest demands on the Club to perform its community-based volunteer lifesaver role to the highest standard, on any given hour of any given day. Our members truly leaned into uncertainty by attending floods and after-hours Search and Rescue callouts without warning or hesitation. Our members dove into community education programmes such as Beach to Bush and courageously stepped in to assist in emergency situations along our coast and waterways even whilst away on holidays.

Patrol teams became stronger with excellent collaborative leadership shown by the existing and next gen PC's and multiple VC's per Patrol. Thank you to those who committed to embracing the ongoing command and structure changes implemented in the last few years. The continuation of 5 full day and a ½ day public holiday patrol were unreservedly conducted to ensure resilience, depth of strength and gender diversity within the Patrols as we sought balance and impactful change based on awards and availability as life returns to the busy beyond belief after Covid. Of course, the true strength in a Patrol on any given day often relies on the overall experience and enthusiasm in the patrol base. This was lifted by the excellent standard of new Bronzies joining the ranks. It was encouraging to see a variety of members step up to mentor and assist. These members did so in their own time, not for remuneration, medals or accolades but to ensure everyone had the supported opportunity to develop and go just that little bit further in the pursuit of excellence as part of the team.

This is what your Club and community expects of you as we are first and foremost a Life Saving club and now part of Emergency Services after all. If we don't continue to execute and indeed exceed our core mission of ensuring community safety, then winning Gold at Aussies or Worlds is a tarnished award. Thankfully


the Club is reaching a happy balance of obtaining both accolades and I applaud both management and the members for this achievement.



The master's women who were very enthusiastic after finally getting onto the water after an injury to their stroke last season were dwelt another setback with one of the crew getting sick. Another lady stepped in to take her place but had to do her full bronze medallion again, having been out of surf lifesaving for more than two years.





The master's men crew is made up of men who had their bronze and rowed before, men who had rowed but their bronze had lapsed and people who had not rowed and did not have their bronze. This crew at the end of the season were rowing very competently and given their enthusiasm I believe will be very competitive next season.

Under 23 women. We had eight girls through the season rowing and training in this division. So that everyone could have a row, we rowed the girls in

the reserve women division as well, but getting to the end of the season we were struggling to get enough to fill the under-23 women's crew. Sickness, going overseas, work, commitment to other sports and study all came into the declining numbers. Training was a real problem with getting the same four into the boat on a regular basis. It was mix and match nearly every session. The thing about this crew though was, by the end of the season, they could match it with all those crews that were beating them easily at the start of the season.

Again, as last season my thanks to Mick Reese for his commitment to the boat section and all the work he does making sure that everything is maintained in safe working order. This covers oars, rowlocks, pumps, hull repairs, trailer wheel bearings, lights, and wiring.

Looking Forward

I am very confident that those crews that finished this season, Master Men, Master Women, and Under 23 Women will all take up where they left off come season 2023 / 2024 as they are continuing to row during the off-season.

I have also been approached from previous under-23 rowers indicating they are wanting to resume rowing again. I hope this comes to fruition as it would be great for the club and a big incentive for other members to come and give rowing a chance.

Everyone both female and male are welcome to come and try rowing, but for the club and for the sport into the future, junior rowers both male and female are desperately needed.


Ski Captain's Report

Beach Captain's Report

What a fantastic season our small Swansea Belmont Beach Team has had. We came away from Aussies with four gold medals, two silver, one bronze, two 4th places and many more top eight performances from only eight athletes who competed on the beach. At the State Senior Championships, we came away with two newly crowned individual State Champions.

Our dominance in the distance events continued at Aussies winning two team gold medals in the 2x1km Beach Relay, with Tye Worell & Ty Leadbeatter making it three years in a row and remaining undefeated at Aussies for the event. Thomas & Mitchell Chalmers won individual gold & silver in the U13 2km Beach Run and then backed up to win the U13 2x1km at their first Aussies. Phoebe Doran and Emerson Leadbeatter medalled again in the U15 2x1km taking the bronze medal in a very close race that came down to the final 100m.

The distance events at Aussies continue to draw very high-quality fields, being an event where there is zero luck involved and it comes down to who is the fastest and fittest competitor on the day. Almost all of the medallists at Aussies this year are current members of state cross country or track teams, so the results our club is achieving in these events is exceptional good and should be highlighted.

Our U15 girls had another great year with Phoebe Doran again winning Aussie silver in the U15 Beach Sprint and Emerson Leadbeatter finishing in 4th place. For the second year in a row we were still the only club in Australia to have two girls in both the sprint and flags finals. Phoebe went on to finish an excellent 4th in Flags with Emerson in 8th and 5th in the 2km Beach Run. Emerson won the U15 Beach Sprint & Flags events at the State Championships and the girls combined to win the 2x1km Relay and place 2nd in the U15 Beach Relay with Kaitlin Rees & Daisy Breasley.

Poppy Doran had another great year wining the NSW U17 Beach Sprint Title & finished a close 2nd in the U17 Flags. At Aussies, she placed 6th in the Beach Sprint final and 10th in Flags.

Erin Hamilton joined our club this year and won her first state medal placing 3rd in the U19 Beach Flags and 6th in the U19 Sprint Final.

Registrar's Report

The 2022-2023 season had registration numbers back to the high numbers before Covid. We had no number restrictions this year which was exciting. The active nipper registrations were at 398 which was a major increase from 2 years ago, which was 260. We had a lot of transfers into our nippers from other local clubs, and one of the highest numbers of nippers we have had in a very long time.

Our total amount of financial members this season was 944 which has also increased mainly due to the nipper increases. We had a total of 737 members in 2019, an increase from the 728 in 2018-2019 and 667in 2017-2018.

We have 78 members in the u-15- Open category of which approximately 45 compete and patrol for the club.

Over the last few years this number has been rising in this senior age group and we are now a very competitive club at branch, state, and Australian levels. Hoping most of our U/14 age group continue into the senior ranks.
