

# History of Swansea Belmont SLSC Club House

#### Leaving the Old Club House

After serving our club faithfully for 20 years the old place had seen its day. Built by volunteers over and above the old outdoor dance floor area, the building had become unsound. An example was masonite floor in the main area, this had deteriorated so much that during our frequent dances the masonite red dust would slowly rise and everyone would emerge with a red glow over clothing and all.

To overcome this problem and to continue our social life we decided to introduce "sand dances", a first in our region. We barrowed tons of sand onto the floor to a depth of six inches and the scene was set for some memorable occasions. At one stage we placed the shark tower in the centre of the hall.

Some of the best times in our history were held in the atmosphere. We would take a day to fill the hall and three months to take it out finding many trinkets on the but failing to locate a certain engagement ring thrown in anger.

Finally, we could do no more and we left the old place of many memories to enthusiastically move to our new clubhouse on the hill.

#### The New Club House

As Club President in 1969 I grew tired of seeing our neighbouring clubs building new club rooms with the assistance of Lake Macquarie Council. Both Caves & Redhead were well underway but no matter how hard we fought no help was coming our way.

The use by date for our old clubhouse was long gone and so I proposed that we go it alone and build a new clubhouse. This was enthusiastically approved by our committee and the process was commenced.

Jim Purcell was secretary at the time. I was determined to see the new building overlooking the beach. Architect Pat Cahill had been on my patrol, and I approached Pat to design the new building, he was encouraged to present a substantial design which wo9uld overlook our beach with storage at ground level along with change rooms, first aid etc and with a large auditorium on the second floor.

His finals plans were accepted by our committee and all necessary approvals secured including a substantial septic system. The ensure the beach overlook it was necessary to raise the level of the rise above our old club house.

I approached John Darling, Lambton and Burwood Collieries to provide us with fill from their chitter waste and many thousands of tons were trucked and spread over the building footprint, raising it to the required level - our thanks to those collieries.

The final location of the building was helped by the decision to have as much beach as possible to the south of the building and north of the breakwater despite some opposition to locate directly above the old clubhouse. And so, work began with the club labour to the fore.

This stage consisted of a very large auditorium, kitchen, bar, balcony & toilet facilities. To span and support the huge auditorium level, Pat Cahill specified very large section steel work.

At this stage the dollars had run out. Again, I approached Burwood Colliery, through Nom Monger, looking for a donation of steel.

There was a substantial quantity of the heavy steel in bye of the borehole pit bottom and Norm said if I could get the steel to the pit bottom, he would bring it up the shaft for Boiler Shop Boss, Alf Jones to sand blast & cut.

Working after hours, with a beaut pit pony called Baldy, over a period of a month I dragged there and up she went from the pit bottom.

Life member George Cooper & his partner owned a fabricating business at Redhead & after perusing Pat's specifications George undertook to fabricate our steel framework. Friend Bill Arthur transported the steel from Burwood to George's factory and the detailed fabrication job was finished and transported to our building site.

The huge weight of the steelwork required two cranes, one each side of the building to raise the frame. It was a credit to George's skill that the frame lowered perfectly onto the holding bolts with one kick from Rex Elvin in the northwest corner seeing the job settle. Now we could continue the build.

The late Alan Russell, stroke of our successful "A" Boat crew and his partner provided labour for our brickwork labour at a greatly reduced cost. Tiles and flooring for our change room toilets and our unique steam room were purchased on "sale" in Sydney, transported in an overloaded, oversized trailer by Trevor Mowbray & I. AB Danvers completed our tiling free of charge, a huge job.

Plumbing and drainage including the septic system was controlled by Sid Johnston with help from "Bing" Crosbie. And so, stage one grew to being suitable for occupation and we left the old club house for the last time in 1970.

Funds were hellishly short, and we tried everything to gather money, including a drive to have old members rejoin to pay fees and help the cause.

Raffles, Benefit Nights, doorknocks, all manner of schemes, even selling members their own brick.

The pressure of having the Australian Championships on our beach in 1972 kept our group going to see stage two at least to lock up prior to the championships.

Key members who assisted throughout the build - Pat Cahill, Trevor Mowbray, Jim Purcell, George Cooper, Allan Russell & partner, Rex Elvin, Arch Salaris, John Wagstaff, Barry Dobb, Kevin Wolfenden, Ken Hodgson, Ab Danvers, Bruce Danvers, Sid Johnston, Bing Crosbie, Ian Gray, Wayne Matthews, Peter Arnall, David Melville, Neil "Sammy" Hinks, Jim Turner, Don Gregory, Tom Gilmore, Brian Drinkwater, Dennis Searle, Carl Croal, Jeff Mowbray, Ross Blatchford and Cliff Marsh.

The cedar window frames, doors and fittings were finally paid for and installed, and the roof tiled, the tiles were discounted by Monier. A stainless-steel balcony balustrade was donated from Stewarts & Lloyds. When we were first married, Leoni & I rented a flat from Alf Luders, a Macquarie Homes director, with the flat next door to the factory. Pat and I were keen to see a timber ceiling and an approach to Macquarie Homes saw us acquire pine floorboards which when erected and sealed provided an excellent dramatic, expansive ceiling. This was erected in the main by volunteer carpenters.

Many of the ceiling boards were carried upstairs by three young cadets - Gary Brown, David Burt and Wayne Rose. Kitchen fittings, toilets and a bar installed by Ron Simpson and sons Gary and John saw Stage Two to lock up. Electrical work upstairs was completed by Keith "Cage" Callen and John Clifford.

The new building helped tremendously with the 1972 Championships and complemented by officials from throughout Australia. Later in '72 we proceeded with the installation of the dance floor. Again, I approached Macquarie Homes and they generously donated sufficient kiln dried brush box timber to install a beautiful sprung floor. This work was done over many weekends by George Cooper, Trevor Mowbray, Arch Salaris, Carl Croal, Dennis Searle, Cliff Marsh & some other volunteers.

Following completion of the dance floor I approached Jim and Tom Michilis for help with levelling the auditorium floor to suit the height of the dance floor. They generously donated material and labour to see the job done and eventually carpet came along.

For almost three years this project was an all-consuming daily task, organising materials, labour, volunteers, tradesmen and constantly checking on jobs completed.

The task had a dramatic effect on my home life and work - but in the long run - worth it.

Surf Life Saving NSW, as the newest gazetted emergency service, plays a key role in emergency response outside of our traditional scope of operations. Special thanks to Jeff Mowbray, Graham Burge, and Lachlan Rae for their participation in intense interagency flood rescue training, supporting the newly formed Flood Response Group across NSW.

Very special thanks to Catherine Gocher, Director of Life Saving, who is standing down from her position after nine years. Your dedication, direction, and countless hours on the beach, ensuring that our commitment to saving lives is professionally administered and patrol rosters are programmed and manned, are greatly appreciated. Also, thank you for your recent negotiations in renewing our life-saving agreement.

Finally, thanks to the permanent and parttime Lake Macquarie City Council Lifeguards who excelled and served alongside our Patrol teams again this season.

I formally thank Mayor Kay Fraser and the elected Council for their support in all our activities. We are fortunate to be represented by two members of Parliament, The Hon. Yasmin Catley MP and The Hon. Pat Conroy MP, who support the club whenever possible. I also extend my thanks to the Hunter Branch Executive for their assistance and advice.

Finally, thank you to the Federal Government for Beach Safety Equipment Funding which directed \$10,000 to every SLSC for the purchase of vital rescue equipment, first aid and medical supplies.

#### A place to gather and feel welcome

We are working towards renewing our Club Lease with LMCC, a process that began in the 2015/16 season. Significant progress has been made, and we are hopeful for a favourable outcome in the coming season. Special thanks to John Waghorn, Chad Griffith, Matt Chalmers, and the building committee for their tireless efforts in addressing Fire Safety and Risk Management defect issues identified by LMCC. After significant works performed, we now await a letter of comfort from LMCC to close out all outstanding aged Development applications.

As we look ahead to the 2024/25 season, I aim to work closely with our board to develop a strategic plan focusing on our club's long-term viability and growth. This plan will address all aspects of our club, including finances, people, structures, systems, processes, community, products, customers, suppliers, and competitors.

Finally, I thank my wife Leanne and children, Oliver, Callum, and Julieanne, for their patience, understanding, and support as I navigated my first year as President of Swansea Belmont Surf Life Saving Club.

I am eagerly anticipating the 2024/25 season and the exciting opportunities it will bring.

# Treasurer's Report

The following two pages set out the financial performance of Swansea Belmont SLSC for the year ended 30 April 2024 and the financial position as at 30 April 2024. These pages were prepared prior the finalisation of the annual audit but are unlikely to change in any material way. More details of the detailed accounts are reported in the audited Financial Statements.

In summary the club generated an Operating Surplus before depreciation of \$170k and incurred capital expenditure of \$174k. It was fortunate however to earn Investment income of \$100k.

#### **Operating Results**

In the 2023/24 financial year there was an Operating Surplus Before Depreciation of \$170k which was in line with the level reported in 2023/23.

An analysis of the sources of income and areas of expenditure is shown in the following graphs. Highlights of the operating revenue were Catering & Function Income of \$110k (which was in line with 2023/23) and the variety of other sources that were all significant and necessary contributors to the club's financial performance. Without any one of those sources of income the club would have reported a significant Operating Deficit (net of capital expenditure) in 2023/24.

#### **Investment Income**

The club earned investment income during the year of \$100k including \$83k from Exchange Traded Funds and \$17k of interest on bank term deposits. This is an improvement of \$72k over the \$28k reported in 2022/23. Prior to 2022/23 the club had never reported investment income above \$11k.

#### **Capital Expenditure**

The club incurred capital expenditure of \$174k during the year, much of which was funded by grants from the NSW Office of Sport and SLSA. This expenditure is not included in the Operating Results.



However, it isn't only between the flags where our efforts make a difference. Early in the season, thanks to Patrol 5 team in responding to an emergency with a bike rider hit by a car across the road from the surf club. The bike rider was in the middle of the road with possible spinal injuries, traffic and crowd control was required. Well done Ethan, Raemon, Harry, Bec, Shaun, Kasey and Will. Lots of comments from the public about how lucky the community is to have support from the volunteer lifesavers and council lifeguards. The patrol continued to provide assistance to the paramedics with the spinal board and even managed to continue monitoring the beach while the incident played out. Very proud of all of you. Patrol 11 also came to the rescue of a fisherman with a fishhook embedded in his hand. Just goes to show, between the flags is only part of our volunteering service. Thank you, not only for your efforts, but also for representing the Club and Surf Lifesaving so well!





We did have a junior male crew start midway through the season but only three of the four have their bronze medallion so again we had no junior crew competing.

On this subject of recruitment, it is not just Swansea Belmont that are having this problem. Apart from Redhead there are no other junior men's crews in the Hunter. Australia wide competitor numbers in all boat rowing divisions have fallen dramatically to what it was in the past.

I would encourage anyone both female and male, young and older, who are thinking about trying rowing, to come and give it a go. You may decide once you have tried it that this is the sport for you. If you are looking for a sport to get fit, rowing requires whole body fitness, as it covers the whole body, legs, torso, and arms.

Not only do we need rowers, but we need sweeps and anyone in the club who wants to try sweeping are more than welcome to contact us and we will arrange for you to try it out. I look at clubs like Avoca who have sweeps that have never rowed but were very good ski paddlers and who have gone on and swept crews to win numerous medals both State and Australian.

I would once again like to acknowledge Mick Reese for his commitment to the boat section and all the work he does making sure that everything is maintained in safe working order.

And Katrina, who does so much for, not just the boat section, but the whole club. Many thanks, once again Katrina.
